TEACHING ASSISTANT FELLOWS (TAF) PROGRAM

THE TAF PROGRAM

Who? Approximately 15 outstanding USC graduate students will be selected to become **Center for Excellence in Teaching (CET) Teaching Assistant (TA) Fellows**.

When? The program runs for one academic year.

What, Why and How?

1. CET TA Fellows work to enhance TA instruction across the university. TA Fellows collaborate to combine their personal teaching expertise with research on best practices and deliver it to all. It's all about TA's mentoring TA's.
2. CET TA Fellows are provided professional development through mentoring with CET Faculty Fellows and monthly CET forums. TA Fellows also receive advanced training in the modern theory and practice of pedagogy.

Responsibilities: Attend monthly meetings, collaborate with CET Fellows and staff, and work to create or edit TA development materials.

- Cover letter stating your name, department, contact information, area of research, progress towards degree, teaching experience, and reason for interest in TAF program
- Statement of teaching philosophy (1 – 2 pages)
- Portfolio demonstrating teaching ability (may include student evaluations, student letters, syllabi, or other course materials)
- Curriculum vitae
- Additionally, have one faculty member familiar with your teaching send a recommendation (as the body of an email message) to uscset@usc.edu with the subject line "TAF_rec_lastname."
